


#### General Safety

Accidents account for 25% of all travel fatalities

Some destinations have high rates of blood-borne diseases such as hepatitis B, C, and HIV


Avoid high risk activities such as unsafe sex, tattoos, acupuncture, piercing, medical, and dental procedures



#### General Safety

Keep valuables, including your passport, safe. Don't attract attention by wearing expensive jewelry, expensive clothing, etc.

Ask your insurance company about travel insurance and medical evacuation insurance



#### General Safety

Consider bringing a first aid kit.

If you bring medications, bring them in the original bottle. Pack them in your carry-on luggage.

Refer to your Travex report for medication restrictions for certain countries.




### General Tips



Make copies of the first 2 pages of your passport. Leave one copy with someone at home and carry the other copy with you in case your passport is lost or stolen.

If you received the yellow fever vaccine, bring your yellow fever certificate with you.

### General Tips



If traveling with children, an original birth certificate and/or passport may be necessary


Bring cash in smaller denominations and new, un-torn bills

Inform your credit card company that you will be traveling and check with your cell phone provider regarding international plans

#### Cultural Considerations

Cultural differences vary widely with destinations. Please check guidebooks, Travax report, and other sources for what behaviors may not be acceptable in other cultures.

Ask before taking photos of people and government and religious buildings.



#### Cultural Considerations

Understand that common gestures, such as pointing your finger, are considered rude in other cultures

Dress modestly if necessary

Be respectful of religious beliefs, holidays, and other observances
